

The Kentucky Historical Society has completed the 2022 National History Day in Kentucky (NHDKy) contest season with our State Contest! On April 23 the first in-person contest since 2019 took place on the University of Kentucky campus and drew participants from across the Commonwealth and boasted 133 students from 24 schools while engaging the talents of 37 volunteer judges. The contest also boasted 12 sponsors from across Kentucky dedicated to celebrating history who selected and presented special awards.

National History Day in Kentucky is like a traditional science fair, but with projects related to an annual history theme. The 2022 theme was "Debate and Diplomacy: Successes, Failures, Consequences." Students work individually or within small groups to develop a project in one of five formats: exhibits, documentaries, websites, performances, or papers. Volunteer judges, recruited from museums, universities, teachers, and the local community, evaluate the projects for qualities such as historical accuracy, sources used, multiple perspectives analyzed, and relevance to the annual theme. At each of this year's 3 virtual regional contests, the top 1/3 of projects in each category advanced to the NHDKy State Contest. Now, the top two junior and senior projects in each category advances to the National Contest, which will be held virtually in early June.

The NHDKy team at the Kentucky Historical Society would like to send our heartfelt appreciation to everyone who participated in the program and practiced the doing of history in a fun competitive environment. Thank you for helping make the NHDKy program possible for students in 2022!
